#### Car Park Reminder

Please remember to follow our car park rules and expectations when dropping or picking up students both in the morning and afternoon.

#### Morning

- Only enter the front car park to enter the kiss and drop off zone, for drop off. Please say your goodbyes with your child inside the car before you stop as we ask you NOT to exit the car. When parents exit the car, this holds up others waiting for drop off.
- DO NOT park in the front car park as this is for the STAFF only.
- DO NOT ENTER back car park for drop off at ANY TIME.
- DO NOT drop off child/ren at the beginning (disabled park area) part of the drop off area. This can be quite dangerous for students as they are exiting cars within the middle of the road.

The collated information from students, staff and the wider community will then be unpacked through the school leadership team and School Council, to see what this means for Findon moving forward.


#### LOGO SURVEY/REVIEW
