#### Tips to help improve your child's attendance at school

Positive attendance at school is important to ensure that students are able to maximise all opportunities for learning and developing their health and wellbeing:

Some tips/ideas to support this are:

- Talk to your child about school and how important it is. You can ask them how they feel about school, what they liked and if there are any problems.
- Reward good behaviour and not bad behaviour. For example, if your child refuses to go to school, do not let them have access to their phones or the internet.
- Set a good example. Show them how you keep to your own commitments.

- Encourage your child to take on hobbies that your child enjoys such as sports and clubs. This will help them develop positive relationships outside of the classroom.
- Have a set time to do homework and go to bed.
- Leave all technology out of their bedroom.
- Pack their school bag the night before with everything they need.
- Have a set time for breakfast.
- Plan to meet up with a friend so they can travel to school together.

As you can see from the above data, we have a good percentage of students across all year levels, having a large number of absences.

This data is up to the 13th of March, and we will continue to monitor the percentages for each cohort. We do understand where illnesses occur, however encourage all our students and families to look at students being at school as much as possible.

This includes, arriving late and leaving early as well. A students' learning and social development can be impacted greatly if absences are left unchecked.

Where needed, please contact the school if there are extenuating circumstances with students who are missing school. Students can suffer from school refusal and become anxious about a number of things; we can support at school through making adjustments where needed.

#### Safety in the car park and drop off area

Please remember to adhere to the safety rules and expectations within our car park/drop off area to allow for the safety of all members within our school community.

We have had some concerns raised in regard to the process off dropping off students and the parent behaviours attached to it.

#### Please remember:

- Drop off is where students are driven into the school car park all the way to the drop off zone at the end of the car park and allowed to exit their cars at a supervised point.
  - **DO NOT allow students** to exit the car space from the middle of the car line as this can cause disruption and have students weave in between cars that may be moving/non-moving.
- 2. Enter and leave the drop off zone at a **slow moving speed** as students are entering into or crossing driveways on their way to enter within the school.
  - We have had occurrences where cars have narrowly missed students when trying to enter the school.
- 3. **DO NOT** drop off or use the disabled parking space for quick drop offs unless you have a valid disabled parking need.
  - **Students are also not be dropped off in this space** as it can be dangerous when students are exiting from a car.
- 4. Please adhere to the council guidelines (displayed outside the school) in regard to driving into the drop off space and parking around the school.

We sincerely appreciate all of our school community working together to support the wellbeing and enhanced safety of all our students at Findon Primary School.




